CUP RUN TO DATE

LLANDOVERY

Llandovery have played three games so far in the cup this season, all at home. They started this campaign against Loughor early in September. The heavier and stronger Llandovery pack took advantage of the difference in league status between the sides to win comfortably 21-9. They then played Tumble, last season's West Wales Champions. Despite losing a forward early on, the seven man pack produced a great display and with the backs running the ball

Despite losing a forward early on, the seven man pack produced a great display and with the backs running the ball at every opportunity, Llandovery won through 12-3. The first round proper saw Kenfig Hill as visitors. The Llandovery pack turned in its most impressive performance of the season. The final score of 32-3 would have been greater but for some desperate defence by Kenfig.

Llandovery will be hoping that today's effort will match that of their last first class visitors in the cup - Maesteg in 1978, when they lost narrowly 11-0 after being 0-0 at half-time.

PONTYPRIDD

Pontypridd as one of the seeded teams in the cup this season, have only played the one game (so far). That was against Senghenydd at home - a difficult local derby which Pontypridd won 10-3. They will be expected to proceed today into the next round but can be assured of another difficult match.

He was born in Neath and at 6'3" is the tallest of the referee's. In school he played lock for Neath Grammer and took up refereeing at the age of 17. He became a W.R.U. referee in 1974 on his return from studies at Portsmouth Polytechnic and he is one of the few referee's to also be a qualified coach.

SHORT HISTORY OF LLANDOVERY RFC

Reports suggest that Llandovery played in the original South Wales Challenge Cup on the 16th February 1878. Llandovery lost by two goals to nil to Newport. Three years later in 1881 Llandovery were represented at the inaugural meeting of the Welsh Rugby Union at the Castle Hotel, Neath and consequently Llandovery were regarded as one of the founder members of the Union.

The fortunes of rugby in the town have fluctuated over the years. In the period around the turn of the century it was a strong religious revival in the district that virtually put a stop to the 'barbaric pastime' as rugby was known. But rugby survived the puritanical element and two world wars. 1948 saw Llandovery a junior union side only returning to full Welsh R.U. status in 1957. Our encounter with Maesteg in 1978 was at a period in the Club's history when we fluctuated between Section C & D of the West Wales League. Since then our playing record has improved spectacularly with our promotion through the divisions to Section A of the League in 1983-84. Our playing record this year shows that we may well gain promotion again as our victory over last years' West Wales Champions, Tumble, showed. Currently we lie second in Section B.

On the 1955 Lions tour of South Africa, Pontypridd were represented by Russell Robins who also played for Wales. He eventually changed codes and played Rugby League for Leeds. More recently everyone knows of the great Tommy David and his association with the club. He will be remembered by all for his powerful, bulldozing runs which used to thrill us all. Of course, we can't mention Pontypridd without the name Bob Penberthy cropping up. 'Bionic Bob' played over 800 games for the club and even now is available for selection if the need arises. He is a member of the selection committee, and an assistant to coach Eddie Jones. For loyalty to one club you need look no further especially now as the rugby 'Transfer Market' hots up.
