Chairman's Address



This is a very proud occasion for us at Llandoverly — a time when we officially open our new Clubhouse facilities and who better to celebrate this occasion with us than the now famous 'GOLDEN OLDIES'.

Reading the team sheet brings back fond memories of the glorious years of Welsh rugby. Carwyn James has described 1971 as the year that British Rugby came of age because it was the first time that the Lions won a series in New Zealand (the Test series was won 2-1) and all the provincial games were also won. It was also, according to Carwyn James, a game based on Brilliant passing and running by the backs.

Wales, too, in the 1970's achieved success not equalled since then — the Triple Crown was won on five occasions and the Grand Slam three times. This was however success with flair and style which resulted in the fanatical support of the Welsh Nation and carried over into the '80's.

Tonights guests are household names — not just with us who remember the 70's and those pilgrimages to Cardiff but also immortalised in the present generation of Welsh rugby players. It is therefore a pleasure for us to invite them to play at Llandoverly.

President's Address



TOWARDS THE SECOND CENTENARY

Ten years ago (Season 1980/81) Llandovery Rugby Football Club celebrated its centenary. During those first hundred years we progressed through important milestones.

We were there at the beginning of the formation of the Welsh Rugby Union being one of its eleven founder members. In 1894 we were one of ten affiliated to the Welsh Rugby Union, a status lost in 1910 due to strong puritanical religious revival in the town, but regained in 1956 when we were re-admitted as full members of the W.R.U.

In 1965 we were admitted to the West Wales Rugby Union and thus playing in its regular league matches.

In 1974 we acquired our own Club House in the old Great North Western Hotel, albeit under lease.

Perhaps the greatest milestone in the club's history was towards the end of these first hundred years when we purchased our present very accommodating playing fields.

Now only, only ten years in to the second centenary the club has developed at a tremendous pace. The playing fields have been developed in to a complex with excellent facilities, with four pitches, ample car parking, full flood lights, changing rooms and culminating in the building this year of our super new club house, — a tremendous achievement from concept to completion within twelve months.

On the field our players have achieved the best results ever, at under sixteen, youth, second fifteen and in particular the first fifteen to maintain good position in Section A of the West Wales League. This was our ticket to Division 3 of the Heineken Welsh National Rugby Leagues, and we welcome and look forward to host and play all clubs in this league, new opponents, a new experience and an adventure.

Yes only, only ten years in to the second centenary and all this achievement already. Congratulations Llandovery R.F.C. from chairman to supporters from players to sponsors, and everybody who has contributed to its tremendous success.

In the Heineken League I am confident that Llandovery will reach parts that "Junior" and "single" clubs cannot reach.

THE GOLDEN OLDIES

Contrary to popular belief the Golden Oldies movement in Wales was not launched by the Old Wales v Old England match at Llandoff in 1983. The Welsh selectors began it all when they picked Tony Faulkner for his first cap in 1975!

What Tony did was prove that age is no barrier when it comes to playing at the highest level. Arguments still rage as to how old Tony actually was when he won the first of his 19 caps, but I can confirm he was the only Over 50 at the recent Golden Oldies Festival in Belgium.

Not that that held him back in anyway... not even the considerable presence of the French front row mountain, Gerard Cholley, could do that. What I'm trying to say and show is that age is no reason to halt a rugby career.

"Too many players hang up their boots far too early," said Welsh Oldies Mr. Fitt, Allan Martin. "As you get older the game becomes fun once again. It's not a time for settling old scores, but for renewing friendships and seeing the world."

That is one of the big attractions at the moment. As well as playing in Ireland and Belgium this year, the Welsh team are currently preparing for the annual trip to Bermuda.

That is easily the highlight of the year and provides ample incentive for even the worst of trainers to put in the odd training run. It has to be done, because not only is Golden Oldies rugby of a high standard, but the trip to Bermuda also includes a trip for the wife!

"We were in on the ground floor of the Bermuda expedition and this will be our fourth year. In the first we played a Bermuda XV, the next we beat England 28-16 in the final and last winter we went out to the All Blacks in the semi-final," said Martin.

"That game characterised everything that's good about the game for the Over 35's — there was plenty of good rugby, total commitment, yet no pressure. We also had a laugh at the first line-out when Andy Haden led his fellow forwards in a team dive to recall the incident of 1979. The only thing that hurt about that was they beat us to it."

"The New Zealanders are very keen on Oldies rugby, but they don't go overboard in the way they play the game. There is a lot more sympathy and empathy that goes into an international in our age group."

"But they do show us a thing or two when it comes to fitness. They don't stop when their rugby days are over, they get involved in other sports or touch and pass rugby."

"That's the next stage in our development. We want to ensure we can keep on playing, and perhaps going to Bermuda, by developing a game for the Over 50's and 60's that doesn't involve too much physical contact, but is still skill orientated."

"The fact that so many clubs want to play against a Welsh Golden Oldies side shows we have still got something to offer, and the large numbers who turn out to watch us add further proof to that argument. You only had to be in Dublin this year to hear the way people were talking about Phil Bennett to realise the old names still have a lot of value."

"And it is good value rugby we will be hoping to provide for you tonight as we continue our build up to Bermuda."

For the record, Allan Martin was one of the younger members of that first, official Welsh Golden Oldies team that played against England in 1983 — and won 30-14. JPR, Dennis Hughes, Clive Shell, Dai Morris, Ian Stephens, Tony Faulkner, Phil Bennett, John Lloyd, Graham Price, Bobby Windsor and David Burcher are still regular members of the side and Wales are still among the elite in the world when it comes to the last generation of players.

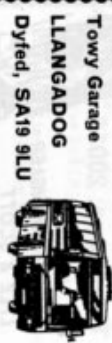
